

#### A Message from Father Shaun Haggerty, Pastor

Pope St. John XXIII who opened the Second Vatican Council in the 1960's had a lot of things to be concerned and worried about when he opened the council. This Council ushered in a great amount of change in the Church. It changed the language of the sacraments from Latin to the vernacular, it brought about more involvement of the lay people, etc. With all the change comes a lot of worry and fear. Some even thought the Church was being destroyed with such big changes. However, Pope John did not let worry or anxiety get the best of him. When asked if he worries a lot, he replied, every night, when I say my prayers, I always tell God, "Well, I did my best. It's Your Church, so I'm going to bed now."

This is what Jesus does in the Gospel today. The boat with the apostles is sinking and taking on a lot of water in the middle of a great storm. In worry and fear they wake up Jesus, who is asleep on a cushion in the boat. Jesus wakes up immediately calms the storm and asks, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith." The boat is a symbol for the Church and the many challenges she will undergo. During these challenges it might seem like Jesus is asleep and not caring about his Church. We might even say, like the apostles, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing."

As we have undergone many challenges in the Church today, we can ask God where are you? As we have undergone the Set Ablaze pastoral planning, it is now that some of the hard changes will begin taking place with fewer Masses. At this time, we can say, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing." But Jesus assures us that He is with us, and He can calm all the storms in our lives and in the Church. We need to trust Him. I invite you to trust as we make some of the hardest changes with Set Ablaze, the reduction of Mass times. A reminder that starting July 6-7th we will have only one Saturday night Mass in Watertown at 4pm with Confession at 3pm with two priests available for Confession. The odd months will be at Holy Name and the even months will be at Immaculate Conception. Then, in January we will make our most difficult changes. St. Mary in Bryant and St. Henry in Henry will no longer have a weekend Mass. Please prepare to welcome them into your parish family when these changes occur. Also, at this time in January, Kranzburg will go to Saturday at 5:30pm and Florence to 8:30am and Clark to 11am on Sunday.

To help keep greater stability in these choppy waters, us priests will spend more time in the areas where we live. For 28 weekends of the year, we will be celebrating the weekend Masses where we live and the remaining 24 weekends of the year we will be visiting the other parishes of the pastorate. So, each priest will visit the other parishes in the pastorate only 8 times during the year. Last year each priest visited each parish 12-14 times. This was needed as it allowed all of us priests to get to know you as we underwent the significant process of Set Ablaze. But in this new year each priest will be in the place where they live for 28 weekends and then eight weekends in each of the other parishes in our pastorate.

Know of my prayer for you and let us all trust Jesus in the midst of the storm. For he does care for us, more than we could ever know.

#### Reducing the risk of Alzheimer's Disease

A University of Minnesota study attributed 41% of dementia cases to 12 modifiable lifestyle factors. Among the 12 lifestyle factors, obesity, high blood pressure, and lack of exercise contributed the most to risk of dementia. Reducing these modifiable risk factors could reduce dementia prevalence.

#### How You Can Reduce Your Risk of Alzheimer's

You can help reduce your risk of Alzheimer's by making healthy lifestyle choices. Here's what you can do:

- Prevent and manage high blood pressure. Tens of millions of American adults have high blood pressure, and many do not have it under control.
- Manage blood sugar. Learn how to manage your blood sugar if you have diabetes.
- Maintain a healthy weight. Healthy eating and regular physical activity can help you maintain a healthy weight.
- Be physically active. Physical activity can improve thinking, reduce risk of depression and anxiety, and help you sleep better.
- Quit smoking. Quitting smoking now may help maintain brain health and can reduce your risk of heart disease, cancer, lung disease, and other smoking-related illnesses. Free Quitline: 1-800-QUIT-NOW (1-800-784-8669)
- **Avoid excessive drinking**. If you drink, do so in moderation.
- Prevent and correct hearing loss. Make sure to talk to a hearing care professional to treat and manage hearing loss.
- Get enough sleep. A third of American adults report that they usually get less sleep than the recommended amount. How much sleep do you need? It depends on your age.

If it seems overwhelming to make all these changes at once, try making them gradually. For example, getting an extra 30 minutes of sleep at night, getting an annual physical exam, or simply taking a walk every day may make a big difference to your cognitive health.
